Do we need a Certifiable Project Management Standard for Organizations?



HOT NEWS: On 4th November, last a new ISO working group started on the feasibility of and preparations for a certifiable project management standard for organizations! Interesting for leaders of project, program and portfolio management teams, but also for individual project, program and portfolio management standard for organizations!

Within each organization one has to deal with a multitude of unique projects, programs and portfolios. Curious about how you can manage and coordinate projects even better? ISO has published various standards that form good guidelines.

The annual plenary meeting of the ISO technical committee for project management (TC258) took place in Seoul at the end of September. A number of working groups subsequently met. In the plenary session the strategy for future ISO guidelines and standards for project, program and portfolio management was discussed and the working groups worked on improving the draft versions of new and revised standards based on comments received.

On January 15th, 2020, the catch-up session will take place for the next "ISO for projects" session, where the main topic will be on a Project Management System Standard.

(This meeting was planned on November 20th 2019, but was postponed to allow more members to participate).

 - 18.30 21.00 Workshop ISO for projects starts

Agenda:

- 1. *Informative*: What has ISO produced for projects and what is going on? (30 minutes) Which of the ISO 21500 family of standards, developed since 2007, are interesting for project, program and portfolio management professionals, their leaders and PMO staff? Which products are being worked on?
- Informative + discussion: Project management system standard (PMSS) (90 min.) Feasibility and preparation of a management system for projects, programs and portfolios, with which organizations can get certified on an independent, globally recognized ISO standard. Think along and participate.
- 3. *Discussion*: How to proceed with the "ISO for projects" community? (30 minutes). The ISO train rumbles on. What does that mean for you and your working environment in the short or longer term? How can this combined IPMA / PMI community be of service to you, and how can you and this community feed the NEN committee members with good ideas for ISO standards?

Continuing Certification Requirements (CCR) Program

Everyone who earns a PMI certification (except for the CAPM® certification) must actively maintain their certification(s) through participation in the CCR Program and renewal of their certification(s) every 3 years.

Taking part in professional development and learning activities / events allows certification holders to earn Professional Development Units (PDU's), fulfilling the continuing certification requirements and ultimately growing and developing as a practitioner.

PDU claim codes can issued by PMI, any PMI approved education provider, R.E.P's, PMI chapters or the PMI Global Accreditation Council. The PDU claim code will be a 10-digit alpha-numeric value unique to each activity or event (for example: 200068JJYM).

You are responsible for claiming your PDU's. The most efficient way to record PDU's is by using <u>CCRS</u>. You must record your PDU's and complete the renewal process before your CCR cycle ends to maintain an active certification status. If you do not earn and record the required PDU's within your CCR cycle, your certification will be suspended.

In order to claim your PDU's, follow the below steps:

- 1. Log into CCRS
- 2. Click on the Report PDU's tab on the left side of the page.
- 3. Click "Course or Training".
- 4. Manually type in the required information (provider name, activity name, dates, and number of PDU's). *Please* do not select any course or provider from the dropdown menu.
- 5. Once you have entered this information, please agree that the claim is accurate and click the submit button.

Consult the <u>PMI Continuing Certification Requirements Handbook</u> for any other questions you might have about PDU's and maintaining your certification.


Press release: IPMA-NL & PMI-NL Master Awards

Thursday November 28th, PMI and IPMA awarded the 3rd annual **Master Research Awards in Project Management**. Four Master students were honored for thesis in project management by a joint award from PMI Netherlands and IPMA Netherlands. Jury selection each year focuses on high quality thesis that aim to improve project management practice through research.

Nouw Wijtenburg, graduated at the TU Delft, received the golden award for the research into stimulating early warning signs (for future problems). The jury praise the thesis for its scrutiny and for the clear recommendations for the project management practice, therefor enabling project managers to enhance the change of project success.

Based on the near equality of them, two silver medals have been awarded to the other winners. They are Anas Hendriks, Utrecht University of Applied Sciences, for the research in leadership in high risk and high complex projects and Tara Kinneging, Twente University, for the research in documenting design decisions in civil engineering projects. Both have produced high quality research which is of value for the project management community.

The work of Arlette Westhof on the relation between risk and returns in wind park investments received an honorable recognition of the jury.

The Most Influential Projects list recognizes projects that have transformed their sectors and the entire business landscape—from technology to healthcare, infrastructure to architecture, finance to entertainment. Honorees include iconic achievements such as Apollo 11, the Boeing 747® airplane, and the Human Genome Project, as well as under-the-radar triumphs like the Svalbard Global Seed Vault in Norway and China's Tengger Desert Solar Park. The top ranked project is the creation of the World Wide Web.

The honorees were chosen from among more than 1,000 high-impact projects identified by 400 leaders in the global project management community, including PMI chapter leaders and members, as well as academics and industry experts. The final selections, made by PMI's thought-leadership team, provide an inspirational reflection on what project work has enabled and the central role it has played in creating our present.

"The projects we've identified provide incredible insights into how project management has changed, is changing, and will continue to change the world for the better," said Sunil Prashara, President and CEO of Project Management Institute. "This list demonstrates PMI's vision of how excellence in project execution will be critical in meeting the challenges and opportunities of tomorrow."

The list is part of PMI's larger 50th anniversary celebration to recognize the important role project management has played over the past five decades and celebrate where the profession is going. Introduction by Jan Cardol CEO of the PMI Netherlands Chapter

Celebrating_PMI's 50th Anniversary includes a new milestone. The refresh of our PMI brand. What is important about the PMI brand? It is our face to the world. PMI Global Communications team ran focus groups with members, students and business leaders. Their focus was to lead our new strategy by creating an image that would showcase our aspirational values: approachable and relatable; experienced, yet experimental. Bold enough to face new frontiers and humble enough to embrace diverse perspectives whilst bringing others along on the journey. Our Netherlands NL Chapter has embraced this new logo and added our Dutch themed tulip icon. So look out for our new Chapter logo in the near future. Welcome from our host, Koen Lambooij, Senior Delivery Manager, Valid IT Consultants

Valid IT Consultants have been a longtime supporter of PMI and have previously hosted us in their Eindhoven offices.

The Future of Project Management: the Rise of Agile - Thomas Swaak, Change Management Discipline Lead, ASML

Thomas took us through an Interactive session which kicked off with an example of the Agile event in the Amsterdam Phillips tower. This Agile event was part of a worldwide event with 4.000 people on 4 continents.

Our challenge on the evening was a truly interactive one: a game focused on creating electrical connects via a steel ball and passing the action onto the next team and location. This demonstrated project management happening in the moment, with constantly changing outcomes and teams. Showcasing the agile approach and self-organizing teams, a process of 7 minute sprints was run. After 7 sprints, the end to end process worked! Thereafter, a lively and energetic discussion on *the future of Agile and Waterfall* versus Agile was initiated. Mixed opinions were spoken up also on whether Agile was a process or a mindset.

The take away was to be versatile and adaptable as a Project Manager. Agile is a mindset *and* a set of rules. There are several ways of working (i.e. Scrum and Kanban). Waterfall also has a mindset: predictable outcomes. Hybrid is the concept projects can use a combination of these two methods, depending on the requirements of the work.





Between Agile, Waterfall or Hybrid, I personally think that the hybrid process is the most natural to the majority of Project Managers. Projects are often complex, and a hybrid approach meets the needs of many situations the best; there will always be dependence and phasing in time, and sprints often work for specific tasks. Using the collective knowledge and experience of your team will always be a critical success factor. At the end, Project Managers must control resources, budget, planning.

Our next challenge was a prisoner's dilemma. We were given conditions to meet, and then the questions of resource management: should the R&D Budget be cut, and if so, how do we get this done? The agreed outcome was to personalize the question based on the situation. To be mindful of our individual Awareness and Motivation. Be clear about the benefits to the organization and individuals.

When working on dilemma such as this, start with the personal and give yourself a disruptive question: What drives you crazy in the current situation? Is that enough to make you cooperate? Do you have a personal benefit from the change? We 'workshopped' this approach by role playing discussions with R&D and business representatives. Discuss options, outcomes and as always, learn what works, discard what doesn't work.

In summary we learned some real world techniques for Agile, and considered the future of project management and what will come next. But in the end, I believe a better question is: who am I today and what will I be doing to make things work?

During the break, the ideas of our session left us very energetic with groups of discussing their first impressions of the evening. Then we were ready for our next session.

Decision Intelligence Solutions for Integrated Business and Supply Chain Planning - Frederick Dufour, CEO, PlanningForce

Enterprise lean planning is a different way of planning. Nearly all planning's solve problems by adding resources. But the world has finite capacities. So we have to look at the available resources and ask ourselves: where are our resource limitations, and can another project be added to the portfolio? Doing this up front will make a big difference.

Today, planning is the place where projects can make the biggest savings through optimizing resources. ELP: Enterprise Lean Planning is multi-level planning combined with decision intelligence. This is an end to end process: from head office to site to department execution. This methodology is driven by all levels.

Frederik followed this summary specifics: Nexter & ELP, exampled how business is run and improved by Planningforce ELP.



The live demonstration was impressive. A lot of data is collected and processed to give better insights. This is a powerful tool to support management decisions and optimize usage of resourses.


ELP is based upon human learning, not machine learning. Planningforce is in control of the intelligence. They collect the actual outcomes to compare to the estimated optimizations. They can also assess continuous improvement to address failures and future mitigation. This impressive presentation was, at times, a bit overwhelming. However the future of using data to make resource decisions in complex models is clear. Fortunately the slide deck used in the presentation will be shared.


